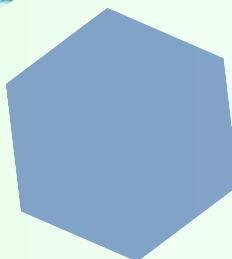

Established in 2016, The Pravin Agarwal Foundation (TPAF) is the vision of noted corporate philanthropist Mr. Pravin Agarwal, Founder and Chairman of Sterlite Power Transmission Limited and Vice Chairman of Sterlite Technologies Limited. TPAF is an NGO dedicated to making pediatric liver transplants affordable and accessible for children in India.

Despite India offering some of the lowest liver transplant costs globally, 90% of children in need of a transplant do not receive it. Approximately 3,000 children in India require liver transplants annually, yet only 12% receive timely treatment due to high costs and limited access. These barriers contribute to 10-15% of fatalities from terminal liver diseases, which could be prevented with timely diagnosis and intervention. TPAF addresses these challenges through systemic reforms, financial assistance, and enhanced access to care.

A healthy liver is vital for a child's survival. Conditions such as Biliary Atresia, Wilson's disease, or Hepatitis necessitate transplants when the liver fails. TPAF supports families by providing financial aid and collaborating with medical professionals, hospitals, and crowdfunding platforms to reform the liver care ecosystem in India.

As of 2025, TPAF has supported over 600+ pediatric liver transplants and kasai procedures, a significant milestone in our journey. Our partnerships with leading hospitals continue to expand, ensuring more children receive life-saving care.

Our focus on pediatric liver transplants stems from a stark reality: only 1 in 10 children in India needing a liver transplant receives it. This gap, uncovered through extensive research, fuels our commitment to address this critical need.

Pediatric liver transplantation is a specialized field requiring advanced expertise, significant resources, and widespread awareness. High costs, limited access to specialized centers, and a lack of dedicated advocates have historically hindered progress. TPAF stepped into this space to bridge these gaps, driven by the belief that saving one child's life uplifts their family and community.

The unique aspect of pediatric liver transplants—where a parent often donates a portion of their liver—adds a profound layer of hope and trust to the process. This act of love reinforces transparency and credibility in organ transplantation, aligning with TPAF's core values.

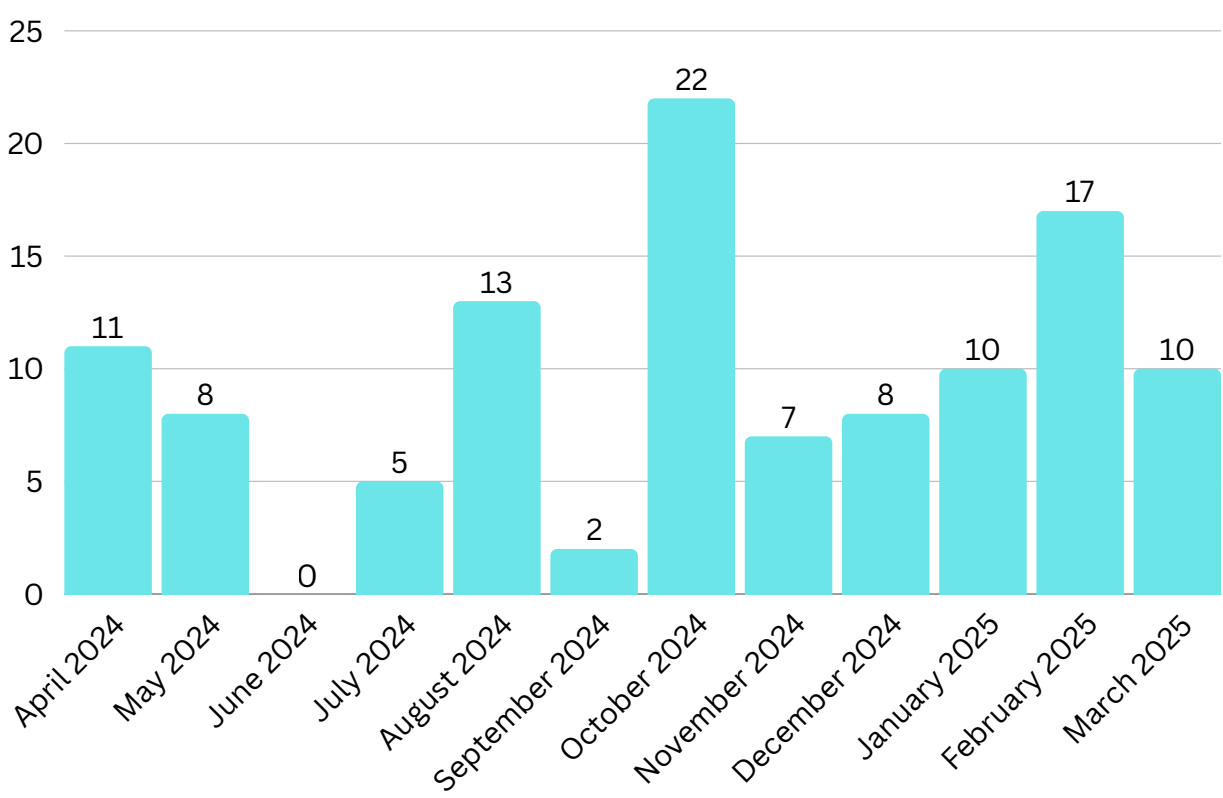

# FINANCIAL YEAR

## 2024-2025

The fiscal year 2024-25 has been a time of great achievements and excitement at TPAF. We have persisted in moving closer to our goal of ensuring that every child in need, regardless of socioeconomic status, can afford and access a pediatric liver transplant. Reaching 600+ patients, or helping the 600+ patients receive a treatment, is a significant milestone that has inspired us to expand and intensify our efforts.

In 2024-25, TPAF assisted a record-breaking 113 recipients nationally for PLTs and KPs, more than any other year. Our partnerships with over 20 hospitals have enabled this unprecedented impact. Below is a breakdown of our life-saving work by month:



# PROGRAMS

## **Pediatric Liver Transplant Support Program**

This program supports children aged newborn to 17 years requiring liver transplants. In 2025, TPAF expanded financial assistance to patients across 20+ hospitals in India. The program promotes accessibility by providing grants, collaborating with crowdfunding platforms, and supporting families to ensure timely, high-quality care. Our efforts aim to make pediatric liver transplants more affordable and accessible, both in India and beyond.

## **Kasai Surgery Support Program**

Biliary Atresia (BA), a congenital liver disease, is a leading cause of pediatric liver transplants. Without timely intervention, children with BA face liver failure by age two. The Kasai Procedure (KP), when performed within 60 days of birth, preserves liver function in 60-70% of cases, delaying or preventing the need for transplantation. In 2025, TPAF increased support for KP, enabling early interventions to improve long-term outcomes for children with BA. This program continues to reduce the burden of liver disease through timely care.

### Ranveer Mali



Life changed instantly for Avinash Ashok Mali when his son, Ranveer, fell gravely ill. The once-healthy boy developed alarming stomach swelling, prompting his parents, Avinash and Harshada, to rush him to NICE Hospital in Kolhapur. Despite multiple tests, no diagnosis emerged. The medical team consulted Dr. Snehvardhan Pandey from Sahyadri Hospital, Pune, for further evaluation.

Following Dr. Pandey's advice, the family traveled to Pune, where a liver biopsy revealed devastating news: Ranveer's liver was severely damaged, requiring a transplant to survive. The financial burden seemed insurmountable, and Avinash, having gathered only one to two lakh rupees, faced immense pressure. Dr. Pandey and transplant coordinator Mr. Prasad Badve offered hope, guiding them toward trusts and charitable organizations for funding and TPAF was one of them.

The next challenge was finding a donor. Tests confirmed Harshada was a match, bringing both relief and fear, as she would need surgery. Despite the risks, her love for Ranveer gave her courage. Soon, the family received word that funds were secured through The Pravin Agarwal Foundation and others.

On December 10, Ranveer was admitted. The next morning, the transplant was done.

Today, Ranveer's laughter fills their home. Avinash expressed his gratitude, saying,

*"My child is healthy after transplantation and The Pravin Agarwal Foundation has helped us immensely in such a short duration. We are very grateful to the organization because of their help, my child is doing well now."*

# Zoha Kausar



Nadeem and Tarunum Kausar's world shattered when their daughter, Zoha, was diagnosed with a life-threatening liver disease. Living in Goa, Nadeem's modest income from a private-sector job couldn't cover the cost of a liver transplant—Zoha's only hope for survival. Fear overwhelmed them as the financial burden seemed insurmountable.

Referred to by doctors in Goa, the family traveled to Aster CMI Hospital in Bangalore to consult Dr. Sonal Asthana. There, they met Ms. Shweta, a compassionate social worker who guided them through the crisis, offering reassurance that Zoha's life could be saved. Despite this support, the staggering cost of the transplant loomed large.

Just as despair set in, The Pravin Agarwal Foundation (TPAF) stepped in, providing the critical financial aid needed to schedule Zoha's transplant. The surgery was a success, transforming Zoha from a frail child into a lively girl whose laughter and energy now fill their home. Nadeem and Tarunum are overwhelmed with gratitude, their eyes brimming with tears of joy.

*"This transplant was made possible only because of the financial support we received. As a private-sector worker earning just 15,000 rupees a month, I could never have afforded it. We owe everything to The Pravin Agarwal Foundation—it's because of their generosity that our daughter is with us today,"* Nadeem said.

Their home, once clouded by fear, now echoes with Zoha's joy—a testament to hope, resilience, and the boundless kindness of those who made her recovery possible.

# Aarush Verma



In Raibareilly, Uttar Pradesh, the Verma family's world revolved around their eight-month-old son, Aarush, whose giggles lit up their modest home. But their joy faded when Aarush's skin turned yellow, his belly swelled, and he grew weak. Nisha, a devoted housewife, and her husband, a Border Security Force officer, were consumed by worry. They rushed him to a local clinic, but inconclusive tests led doctors to refer them to Max Healthcare Hospital in Delhi.

After a grueling journey, a liver biopsy at the hospital revealed Aarush had cholestatic liver disease, a severe condition requiring a transplant to survive. The staggering cost overwhelmed the family, far exceeding their savings of ₹4 lakh gathered from relatives and personal funds. The hospital's transplant coordinator became their guide, connecting them with The Pravin Agarwal Foundation (TPAF), which helped to secure additional required.

Tests confirmed Nisha as a suitable liver donor, bringing hope mixed with fear of major surgery. Her love for Aarush fueled her resolve. When funds were secured, Aarush was admitted for the transplant. The surgery was a success, with Nisha recovering well and Aarush's new liver functioning perfectly.

Today, Aarush's laughter echoes through their home, a testament to the expertise of Max Healthcare's team and TPAF's critical support. The Verma's will always cherish this miracle, born of love, courage, and the kindness of those who made it possible.

### Improving Understanding of Pediatric Liver Transplants through our Patient Outreach Program

Since 2016, TPAF has been collecting information from the partner hospitals to understand the landscape of and critical challenges surrounding pediatric liver transplants in the India.

Recently TPAF also connected telephonically with parents of children who were financially supported by TPAF for their liver transplant.

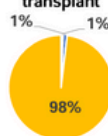
The findings of these initiatives have been put forward in the form of a “Patient Insight Report”; key objectives of the which are as below:

- Understand demographics of the children who undergo a liver transplant

#### Quality of life and challenges to follow up care after a liver transplant

Over 98% parents were satisfied with their child's health post-transplant, which demonstrates the transformative impact of this unique medical intervention.

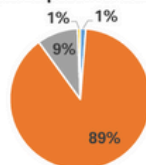
##### Satisfaction with outcome of Liver transplant

89% of children led a healthy life after their liver transplant, a small number of children did suffer from symptoms ranging from frequent bouts of fever to those like rejection of transplanted liver and biliary obstruction.

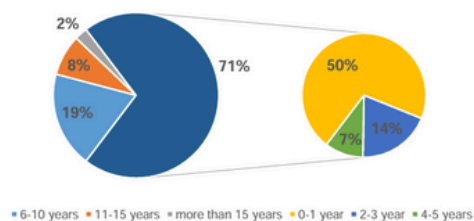

### Demographics of the children who undergo a liver transplant

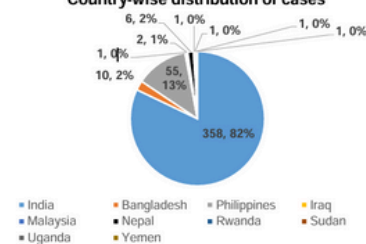
Out of the total 436 children 62% were male & remaining were females. 71% of children undergoing transplant were under the age of 5 years. Further, 50% of them were under age of 1 year.

**Age distribution of pediatric liver transplant cases**



82% of children supported by TPAF were Indian nationals, 13% were from Philippines and a small proportion from neighboring countries like Bangladesh and Nepal.

**Country-wise distribution of cases**

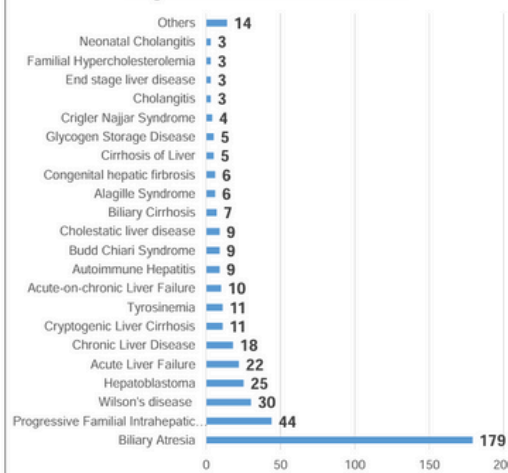

### Demographics of the children who undergo a liver transplant

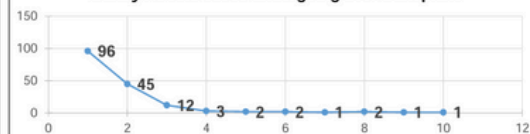
Biliary Atresia with 41% topped the list of indicators for liver transplant among the study group followed by Progressive Familial Intrahepatic Cholestasis (10%), Wilson's disease (7%) and Hepatoblastoma (6%).

**Diagnosis-wise distribution of cases**



58% of children suffering from Biliary Atresia underwent transplant in the first year of life and another 27% in the second.

**Biliary Atresia cases undergoing liver transplant**

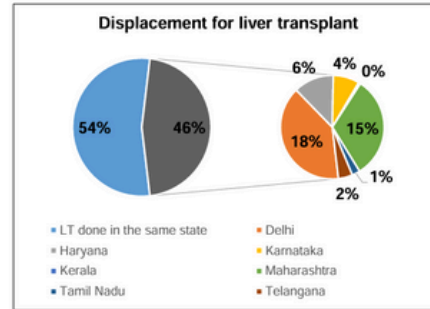
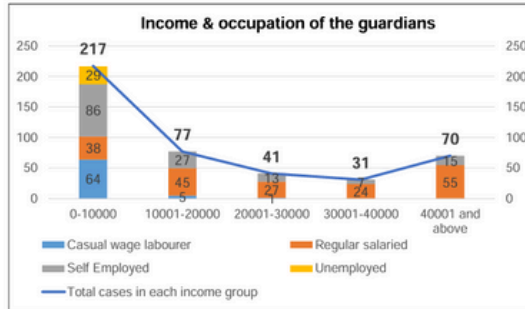




### Demographics of the children who undergo a liver transplant

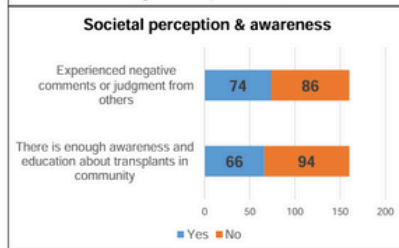
50% of the families had income less than INR 10,000/- per month, making them highly vulnerable to financial stress for expensive treatment like a liver transplant. A majority of the cases the earning members were regular salaried (43%) while another majority were self-employed (34%).

46% of families had to seek transplant care outside of their state of origin. These families sought care in states like Delhi, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Telangana which are also known to have state of the art transplant care centres.

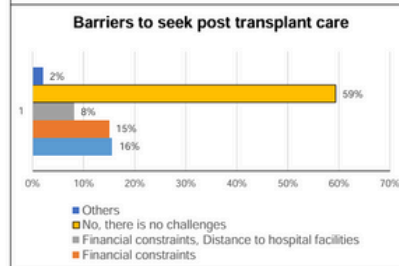


### Societal awareness and perception about liver transplant

Over 59% of parents agreed that there is not enough awareness and education about transplants within their communities. Nearly 15% of parents were also advised against the procedure.



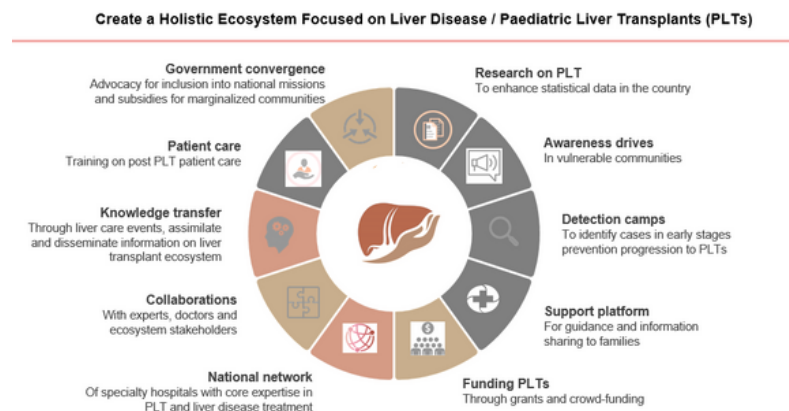
Distance from the Hospital and financial constraints emerged as top barriers for seeking timely post-operative care.



The findings of the report are on the basis of a telephonic outreach to a group of 160 parents of children who were financially supported by TPAF for their liver transplant.

We plan to forge new collaborations with medical institutions, NGOs, and policymakers to build a more robust pediatric liver care ecosystem.

### **Expanding Outreach and Awareness**

Through detection camps, awareness campaigns, and digital platforms, we will empower communities with knowledge about early diagnosis and treatment options.

### **Advancing Thought Leadership**

TPAF will host additional events like the Affordable Liver Transplant Conclave (ALTC) and share insights to drive systemic change in liver care.

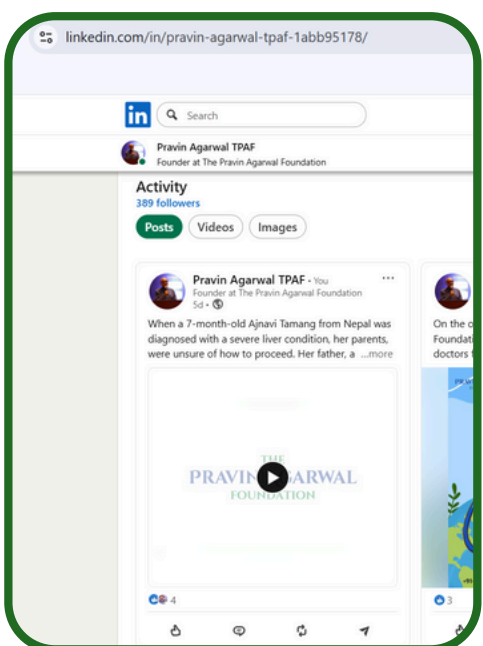
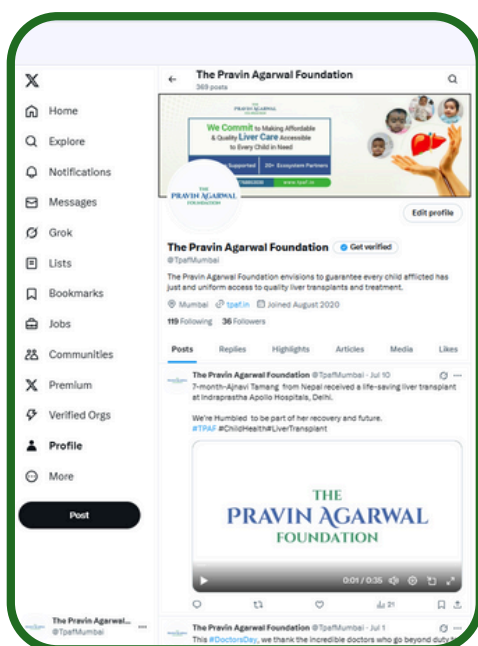
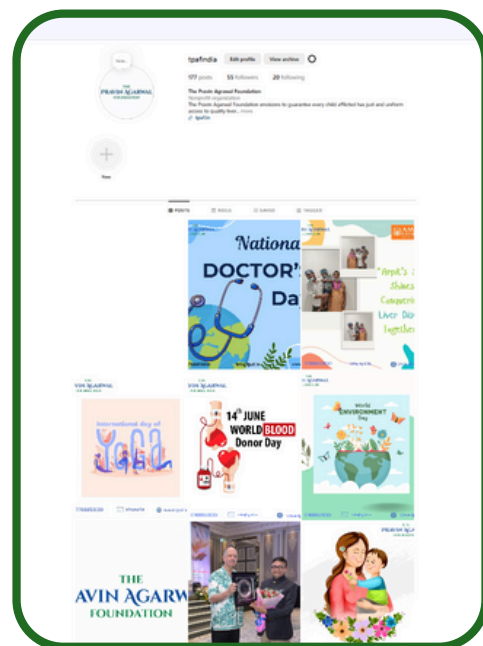
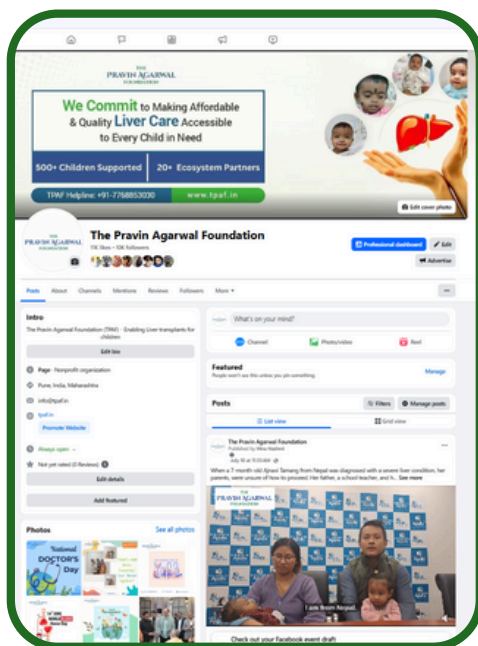
TPAF focuses on building an ecosystem for high-quality pediatric liver care, having already facilitated over 600 PLTs and planning for 150 more in 2025-26.
